#### **7.4 Equipment and Development**

The Chairman, Bertil Palsrud (NOR), reports on his meeting in Zürich (SUI), 13<sup>th</sup> April 2019:

- There were no changes regarding Ski Jumping equipment proposed this spring.
- Current rules are subject for execution by authorised FIS controllers.
- New back protector by ORTEMA was accepted during the sub-committee meeting.
- Motion sensors were used at some World Cup events last season; however decision was made to stop their use at World Cup level until further development and full reliability.
- Norwegian medical students carried out a research on injuries in Ski Jumping and they were requested to present their finds during the FIS Autumn Meetings.
- A new system for bindings was proposed by Mr. Freitag (GER). The Sub-Committee supported the development; however had no technical data available in April.  
The description has been presented (see FIS [Cloud](#)). Confirmed by the Jumping Committee.
- Schoeller introduced a new type of fabrics for Jumping suits in accordance with the FIS specifications. Confirmed by the Jumping Committee.
- Specification regarding no allowed overlap between underwear shorts and socks was introduced into guidelines for equipment control and are available on the FIS [Website](#)
